Historical Sketch.

In the month of February, 1893, W. H. Harris and J. S. Hines donated five acres of land to the North Carolina Christian Missionary Convention, for a school location. An additional five acres were purchased; thus securing ten acres in a body, for campus and building purposes, adjoining the town of Ayden.

Subscriptions were taken for the immediate erection of a building. Work was begun on a two-story frame structure in May of the same year and was nearly enough completed to be occupied in September; when the first term of the College opened with 17 pupils in attendance. In the spring of 1894, the building was completed in time for the first annual commencement. In the same year an additional building for the musical department was erected and an enrollment of 70 pupils was reached. Four teachers were engaged in the work during the first year. A Church was organized in this year and regular services were held in the College building.

At the Convention held at Kinston, October 1894, seven trustees were elected with the provision that two should retire and be succeeded by two others, annually. It was also ordered that a charter be drawn up. This was ratified by the legislature in 1895.

General Information.

LOCATION.

CAROLINA CHRISTIAN COLLEGE is located in the town of Ayden, Pitt county, N. C., on the Scotland Neck Branch of the Atlantic Coast Line, 22 miles from the A. & R. Junction. Ayden has the reputation of being one of the most healthful places in Eastern North Carolina. It is a growing town with all the advantages of larger places, and free from many of their evil influences. The quiet seclusion of the place invites to study and the prevailing influences favor the formation of good habits and the development of a noble Christian character.

Carolina Christian College is the property of the North Carolina Christian Missionary Convention, but is in no sense sectarian or exclusive. It offers equal advantages to all denominations.

EXPENSES.

The cost of a year at Carolina Christian College is as low as that of any school of its class in this country, and there is no reason why any young man or woman, of character and energy should not be able to get an education, by their unaided efforts, since they may earn almost enough during vacations, to pay the expenses of a year here. It is true we cannot advertise any free tuition as we have no endowment, but every encouragement possible will be given to those without means; provided they are worthy; besides it is not tuition fees that count

up in the expenses of a student, but board is a much more important item. This is so low here as to bring the whole cost of a year within \$75.00.

The following schedule gives the rates of tuition, board, etc.

Reading, Spelling, Object Lessons, Numbers, etc., \$1.00 per month.

Intermediate Arithmetic, English Grammar, Geography and History, \$1.50 a month.

Analytical Arithmetic, Elementary Algebra, Latin Grammar, \$2.00.

Higher Algebra, Geometry, Advanced Latin, Greek Grammar, Rhetoric, etc., \$2.50.

Higher Mathematics, Advanced Greek, Chemistry, Astronomy, Metaphysics, etc., \$3.00.

Board, including fuel and lights, \$6.00 to \$7.00 a month.

Music \$2.50.

RELIGIOUS EXERCISES.

In the morning of every school day short religious exercises are held; consisting of scripture reading, singing and prayer. All students are required to be present at these services. A pronounced Christian character is urged upon all but each will be allowed to attend the church and Sunday School of his choice.

Sunday School is conducted at the College every Sunday morning, to which all are invited; but not compelled to attend.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS.

The buildings consist of a commodious frame structure two stories high, containing two large study and recitation rooms, fitted up with improved desks and made comfortable in every respect. In addition are one small recitation room, vestibules, cloak room, etc.

The Music department is conducted in a separate building, constructed especially for the purpose, and supplied with a fine new piano.

The buildings are located in a beautiful oak grove containing ten acres of high, gently rolling land. The location is removed from the noise of the town, being about two hundred yards from the street. There is a well of as pure water on the grounds as can be found in Eastern Carolina.

DISCIPLINE.

The discipline will be firm but mild. Every thing possible will be done to promote habits of morality and industry, but when a student, from habitual disregard of authority and inattention to duty, is found, after suitable attempts to reform him, to be incorrigible, the Principal will make the facts known to his parent or guardian and request his withdrawal without notoriety.

EXAMINATIONS.

Quarterly, or more frequent examinations as the teachers may determine, will be held on all subjects studied. Each student will be required to make an average of at least 65 per cent. in order to be advanced. All examinations will be conducted in writing.

LITERARY SOCIETIES.

Two literary societies have been organized—the “Philothean” and the “Zeta Sigma”;—the former for the young ladies and the latter for the young men.

These societies may be made valuable aids in the instruction and culture furnished by the College.

ANNOUNCEMENT.

We take pleasure in announcing to the brotherhood that the present condition of the school is such as to authorize the employment of an additional teacher and that the services of Miss Marie E. Hill, of Nashville, Tenn., have been secured.
